Life is full of contradictions. I have found that I can covet some indulgence and condemn the extravagance of someone else at the same time. When I observe a particularly ostentatious purchase, I'll cynically whisper to Donna, "I wonder if they tithe?" Yet, that doesn't seem to be a concern when I'm surfing websites and salivating over running shoes or watches. To varying degrees, opportunism and altruism claim real estate within most of us.

However, I have often discovered that the joy of finding that unique and meaningful gift is far more enduring that the caffeine rush of delight that accompanies the latest purchase sitting in my garage or resting on a shelf in my closet. Parents cry at graduations because in that moment they suddenly realize how ridiculous it was to ever question whether the sacrifice was worth it. Joy unspeakable.

Stewardship isn't an annual obligation, it is a way of life, a worldview that sees life as "a gift to be received with gratitude and a task to be pursued with courage." (Confession of '67). Helen Keller wrote, "Believe, when you are most unhappy, that there is something for you to do in the world. So long as you can sweeten another's pain, life is not in vain."

Generosity and love are synonymous when love is understood as a verb: Love is self-giving, giving is an offering of self.
