OUR JOURNEY THROUGH A TRYING TIME

"The farmer plants the Word ...The seed cast in the weeds represents the ones who hear the kingdom news but are overwhelmed with worries about all the things they have to do and all the things they want to get. The stress strangles what they heard, and nothing comes of it." - Mark 4:14, 18-19 (The Message Translation)

Sigh! Big Sigh!! Periodically, you will read something that makes you question the wisdom of the whole human experiment. When God sees how far from the mark we so regularly aim and how restlessly we run in the wrong direction, does our Lord feel a tinge of regret? After all, it wouldn't be the first time (Danger! Flash flood warning! Watch out for animals running in pairs!). Could it be that Edvard Munch's The Scream is the closest thing we have to an authentic portrait of God?

Ruth Barrett, in an insightful article in The Atlantic, explores The Mad, Mad World of Niche Sports Among Ivy-League Obsessed Parents. We meet Sloane, of Fairfield County, Connecticut, who's a bit stressed over her daughter's junior-squash rating. I didn't even know there was such a thing. Well, if the daughter doesn't maintain a 5.0 rating as a squash player, she's going to wind up at a state university. Horrors! There was a crisis about a year ago. At a California junior squash tournament with her daughter, Sloane was on the phone strategizing with her husband, who was at a junior fencing tournament in Ohio (Remember, they live in Connecticut). It seems their teen squash prodigy had been victimized by "a malicious refereeing" dispute. Sloane's husband was having his own problem as their mini-swashbuckler (officially, you would call her a saber fencer) had been nicked in the jugular in a tournament match.

It provided a brief moment of clarity. Sloane "I thought, "What are we doing? It's the Fourth of July. You're in Ohio; I'm in California. What are we doing to our family? We're torturing our kids ridiculously. They're not succeeding. We're using all our resources and emotional bandwidth for a fool's folly." Yes! I thought. Wisdom makes an appearance. But, alas, the seed of wisdom "cast in the weeds represents the ones who hear the kingdom news but are overwhelmed with worries about all the things they have to do and all the things they want to get. The stress strangles what they heard, and nothing comes of it." Peer/culture pressure and the survival-of-the-fittest, myth of scarcity mindset that distort our understanding of what our children most need, soon threw them back into the spiritual meat-grinder of success and achievement. By this summer, Sloane was shifting one child from sabers to foils, training the squash queen in a friend's secret underground bunker court, still trying to get the edge for the college applications. And as insurance, the squash expert has added rowing, "My daughter is 5 foot 11," she said. "That's not the optimum body for squash. She has the frame for rowing. I've always had it in the back of my head. Rowing moves the needle way more."

It doesn't have to be this way. There is a wholly and holy different way. This Sunday, you will hear the Word of the Lord proclaimed by a collection of bright and engaging seniors who have been nurtured to know their value is not measured by a trophy résumé, but assured through the grace of God. In the end, it's not about the high life, but about a whole life.

Watch out for the weeds!



Anyone with an interest in handbells is welcome to sit in on a rehearsal.




