The newer the car, the more advanced the technology. Our late-model cars, perhaps the last generation of gas-powered vehicles, come equipped with more connectivity, computing power, and cameras than Apollo 11, all of which has come to seem essential even though our morning commute may only extend to twenty minutes. We can back out of the driveway without the assistance of a chiropractor, courtesy of the rearview camera. We can pull into the garage without crashing into Jr.'s trike, thanks to the sensors surrounding the chassis. Driving on a six-lane freeway can be a bit frustrating with all the alarms, warnings, and beeps alerting you to lane lines, passing cars, and slow vehicles. Call it the technology of alertness, developed to compensate for human inattention and our unacknowledged blind spots. Today's cars will even tell you to take a break if you hit one too many lane lines or your speed is overly inconsistent. They say that in the near future our driving skills will vanish because our cars will drive themselves. What was Greyhound's motto? Leave the driving to us. I'm old enough to confess that such a world is beyond my capacity to comprehend.

We drive cars that are more alert than we could ever hope to be. Will our awareness of the world around us diminish as we rely more on technology to pay attention for us? The Psalmist declares, "I will extol the Lord at all times; his praise will always be on my lips." Such gratitude extinguishes when we are not alert to all for which we could be thankful were we to just pay attention. Where'er there is breath, there is reason for thanksgiving.

Henry Van Dyke, the Presbyterian pastor remembered for composing the lyrics of the treasured hymn, *Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee*, also said, "Gratitude is the inward feeling of kindness received. Thankfulness is the natural impulse to express that feeling. Thanksgiving is the following of that impulse." So, let us pay attention, sense the impulse, and act on it every day.




