This Sunday, March 7, marks 52 weeks since our SMPC family gathered for *Gratitude Sunday* – a time to celebrate the blessings of being God's church in this corner of South Charlotte. All received "gratitude cards" and were asked to complete this sentence: I am grateful that SMPC is my church home because... Responses ranged from the quality of preaching to love of the music program. One note reads, "I find peace, comfort, a time of reflection and friendship." While another says, "I get to climb trees and have lemonade and cookies!"

We have much to be grateful for and to celebrate one year later -- our vaccinated neighbors, our children reuniting with friends at school, small groups are gathering on our SMPC campus, and the number of COVID-19 cases is on the decline. As of March 1, clergy are eligible for the vaccine and we pray our staff will soon be immune! And with the warmer weather we are excited to offer in-person, outdoor worship beginning **Sunday**, **March 21**, at

8:30 a.m. On-line reservations begin Thursday, March 18. Worshipers will wear masks and bring chairs. A weekly 8:30 a.m. outdoor worship service will be offered (weather permitting) until we can safely transition to a limited capacity indoor service.










If you have ROKU, Apple TV, or Amazon Fire TV, you will now find SMPC among the offerings on the BOXCAST channel.
